Camp Week A

Join us for this exciting immersion into all things Irish dance! In addition to learning Irish dancing technique and working on the first three soft shoe dances, the jig, the reel, and the slip jig, dancers will be exposed to the cultural side of this exciting dance form through storytelling, video, Irish crafts, and games. They'll also learn about how Irish dancing is structured and how competitions work. For returning students who have already taken Irish dancing, this will be a chance to refine your skills, learn new ones and experience the true Irish side of the dancing. Please bring a bag lunch.

Returning dancers competing in Beginning-Novice

For our dancers who have completed Ennis, Galway or Limerick this year in either location, come spend a week learning even more exciting dances (including hard shoe!). Returning dancers with slow hard shoe

For dancers from our Killarney, time to focus on what we need for Prizewinner (and getting that dress!). Tralee dancers, let's take a good look at what makes a prelim dancer. How, as novice/prizewinners, can we all prepare to compete at that level? What are some realistic goals to set for ourselves with the upcoming competitive season? We'll also work on maximizing our practice time at home (especially those of us who are older and have less time). And yes, there'll be teams, too, and plenty of fun cultural stuff to do.

For those of you from the Dublin and Dundalk classes, you already know what makes a championship dancer. Now, what do you personally need to do to turn that corner yourself? Or take the next step into the placements, or qualify for the next major championship? Let's step back and really hone in on the wrinkles that need to be ironed out, while making your material work better for your style of dancing. We'll use video to constructively analyze our dancing, and fine tune our drills and technique. We'll also really work our figures and take plenty of time to enjoy the Irish side of our time together. Bring your lunch.

Summer Camp Policies

Registration: A \$25 registration fee is required to reserve your dancer's space in class. The deposit is refundable with your tuition payment only. Class spaces are limited, therefore please register early in order to secure a place in the camp of your choice. The tuition balance is due in full on the first day of camp.

Location: Camp will be held at our Raleigh studio, located at 6166A Falls of Neuse Rd. For directions, please go to our website, at www.iniscairde.com

Attire: Dancers are asked to wear a T-shirt and athletic shorts to class, with Irish dancing shoes and socks, or bare feet for new beginners. Irish dancing shoes are available for purchase locally at Footlights, (919)832-4090.

Pick-up and Drop off: The studio will be open by 8:45am. Early Drop-off is available for dancers who need to arrive at the studio prior to 8:30am daily at a cost of \$5 daily or \$25 for the week. Please register in advance for Early Drop-Off. Students must be picked up promptly at the end of camp each day.

What to bring: Dancers will need to bring a healthy bagged lunch and water bottle to class daily, as well as athletic shoes or tennis sneakers. Changing socks throughout the day helps prevent blisters when it's hot outside.

Showcase: There will be a short performance at the end of each week of camp so that our dancers can show you their new skills and tell you about their week. Please arrive at 12:30pm on the Friday of Camp Week A in July, and at 1:30pm on the Friday of Camp Week B in June for an informal showcase.
